

# 2022-23 Global Fellowship Program: Global Youth Culture and Subcultures

## Online via Zoom

The Area Studies Centers at The Ohio State University's Office of International Affairs are now accepting applications for the 2022-23 Global Fellowship Program: Global Youth Culture and Subcultures. In this year's program teachers will learn about different youth cultures and subcultures in East Asia, Eastern Europe/Eurasia, Latin America, and the Middle East. This topic will inform educators on how different subcultures may have ties to different political, cultural, and/or social movements and ideologies. Participating educators will then be able to bring back what they've learned to their own classrooms to help students understand and learn about people their own age in different parts of the world.

This program is free for all pre- and in-service K-12 and community college educators. Over this 7-month program, educators will participate in 6-7 sessions, hearing from regional experts with knowledge on the program topic. All program sessions will take place on Saturdays from **9AM-12PM Eastern Time online via Zoom**. Final dates and subtopics for all sessions will be announced in June 2022.
