Polish Studies Initiative 2016 Research Grant Competition

for Polish Studies

The Polish Studies Initiative (PSI) announces a grant competition for all faculty and post-candidacy PhD students at OSU. Applicants can request up to \$1,500 in funds. PSI aims to support research and curriculum development in the arts, humanities and social sciences that will enhance the understanding of Polish society and culture. In the project statement, candidates should explain their disciplinary background within the field of Polish studies, their goals for this grant period, and a brief outline of their research or curriculum development plans. Projects focusing on Polish-American culture are also welcome. Research should be carried out between May 1 and September 1, 2016. Those awarded grants will be asked to present the results of their work under the grant at a public meeting sponsored by PSI in the Autumn 2016 semester.

Eligibility:

- 1) Applicants must be enrolled as OSU students or employed as OSU faculty at the time of application as well as throughout the period of the award.
- 2) Graduate students must be post-candidacy at the time of their research.

- 3) A separate research budget, including a full itemization of travel and lodging costs, other anticipated costs, *and a list of all other sources of funding*
- 4) Four- to five-page double-spaced statement elaborating the purpose, method, anticipated products, and significance of the project
- 5) Curriculum vitae
- 6) Graduate students: please include a letter from your PhD advisor detailing how this research grant will aid your dissertation research
